- 3. Liz offered welcome remarks.
 - a. Commented on the good attendance.
 - b. Introduced board members.
 - c. Introduced Ann Sharp from John Cook's office.
- 4. Ann Sharp's presentation.
 - a. She introduced herself and her role in Cook's office. The office number is 703-425-9300.
 - b. Braddock Road widening project.
 - i. Still in the planning process.
 - ii. Next community meetings with the contractor: June 9th at Lake Braddock cafeteria at 7:30 pm. Residents can ask questions about the project and get more information.
 - iii. Intent is for communities to have input into the project with ideas/concerns/etc. so residents encouraged to attend.
 - c. Traffic calming devices in CW.
 - i. Hoping to be installed in July. Problems with contractor bid, needed to be resolved.
 - d. World Police and Fire Games.
 - i. June 26 July 5
 - ii. One of the largest participant events in the world, second to Olympics.
 - iii. Mostly taking place in Northern VA
 - iv. Approximately 8000 athletes, all events free.
 - v. GMU will host several events.
 - vi. Many volunteer positions open, perform internet search on it.
 - vii. Not a lot of traffic impacts expected on this end of Braddock Road, but there may be some impacts around GMU.
 - e. Concerns of boarding houses in neighborhoods.
 - i. If suspect there is one in the neighborhood call Cook's office or

 - f. Question from the audience: what is the biggest problem in the Braddock District?
 - i. Speeding, especially through communities.
 - ii. That was result of survey a couple years ago.

- iii. Communities can request the trailers that post actual car's speed be used in their community. Call Cook's office.
- 5. Financial Report
 - a. Dan passed out the proposed budget and the financial statement.
 - b. Dan went over each document.
 - i. Increased budget for printing.
 - ii. Added dumpster day line item since it was such a success.
 - iii. Question on the line item for CERT and Neighborhood watch.
 - 1. Still in the budget in hopes that someone will step up and take the lead on it.

 - 3. Comment that Department of Homeland Security web site has training materials.
